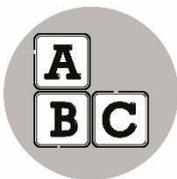


What is It

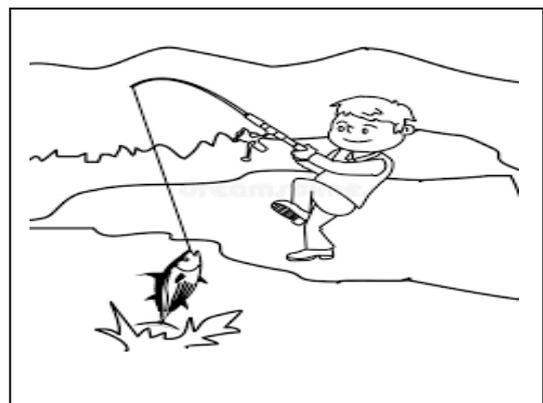

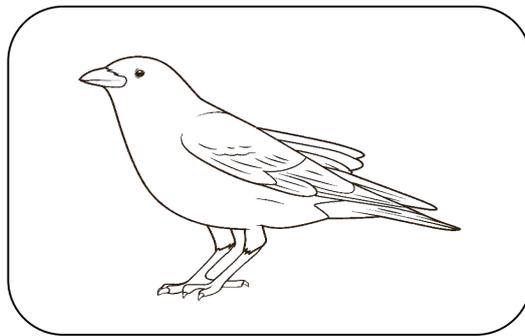
