

CONTEXT CLUES (Definition and Exemplification)

When you read stories and other literary texts, you often come across words that are difficult for you to understand. This might cause delay in understanding what the text is trying to convey. Context clues are words in the sentence that help you understand the meaning of unfamiliar words.

What is It

The underlined words in the selection are difficult words. There are words surrounding unfamiliar words that will give you a hint on what it means. We call these hints, **context clues**.

Think!


A **context clue** is there to help you find out the meaning of unfamiliar words in a sentence. It could be through giving the definition of the words or through giving examples.

Examples:

1. Fluoroscopy, examination with a fluoroscope, is a common practice.
2. Celestial bodies, including the sun, moon, and stars are fascinating.

Example 1 is context clue through **definition**. The words after the comma is the definition of the word fluoroscopy.

Example 2, on the other hand, is a context clue through **exemplification**. You are given examples that would give you an idea on the meaning of the unfamiliar words.

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
