

RHYMING WORDS

Rhyming words are words that sound similar when you say or hear them. We use rhyming words because it can be fun to play with language. Many different poems and songs use rhyming words. Most children love to sing and recite nursery rhymes. However, it can be challenging to think of words that rhyme, because sometimes most words almost rhyme with another word.

For example: **car – bar** **house – mouse**
