



ANALYZING A STORY IN TERMS OF ELEMENTS

Analyzing a story in terms of elements requires you to learn about the basic elements of a story, the basic elements of a story are Setting, Character, Plot, Conflict and Resolution.

Setting refers to the time when the story happened and the place where the story happened, the series of events and the action of the characters in the story is the Plot.

A plot should have a very clear beginning, middle and ending so the reader can appreciate every actions made in the story as well as they can be able to follow from beginning to end.

Character refers to the person or animal who do the actions and speak the dialogue of the story. The Characters in the story should be well described by the author in the story that gives the reader the opportunity to visualize each character. In every story, there should have the Main Character that leads the way on how the plot will develop and usually the one who will solve the problem. However, the other characters of the story are equally important because they are the one that provides and support the additional details of the story.

Conflict is the problem that took place among the characters in the story.

And lastly the resolution, this refers to how the action of the characters solved the conflict or the problem in the story.

In analyzing a story in terms of its elements, you have to familiarized the elements of a story. Such as the;

Setting is the time when the story happened and the place where the story happened.

Plot is the series events that took place that makes up the story.

Characters refers to the person or animal who do the actions and speak the dialogue in a story. The Characters in the story should be well described by the author in the story that gives the reader the opportunity to visualize each character. In every story, there should have the Main Character that leads the way on how the plot will develop and usually the one who will solve the problem. However, the other characters of the story are equally important because they are the one that provides and support the additional details of the story.

There are types of Characters in a story, these are;

- Protagonist is the main character in a story or the central character in the story. They should be well described by the author to give the reader a clearer view of its personality in the story.
- 2. Antagonist is the villain in a story or the forces that opposes the central character.
- 3. Static are the characters that does not change significantly in the story.
- 4. **Dynamic** are the characters that changes significantly.
- 5. **Round** are the complicated characters that has many sides and emotions in the story.
- 6. Flat are the simple characters that portrays few traits.

The following list of traits that the Characters of a story may portray.

Conflict refers to the problem that took place in the story.




