










What Is It

The words use in the story to describe Glen's house from school is **far** while the word use to describe Glen's meter stick is **long**. These words are called **describing** words.

From the start of the lesson about describing words, you have learned that describing words are words used to describe persons, places, things and objects.

In describing words for things in length we use high, low, tall, short and long. In describing words for places in distance we use near, far, nearby, wide and narrow.
