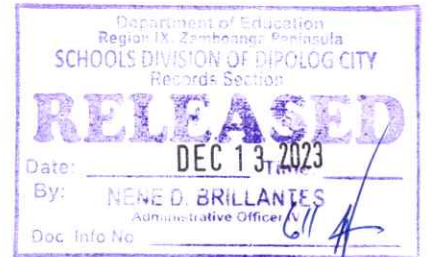

Fairies/Elves

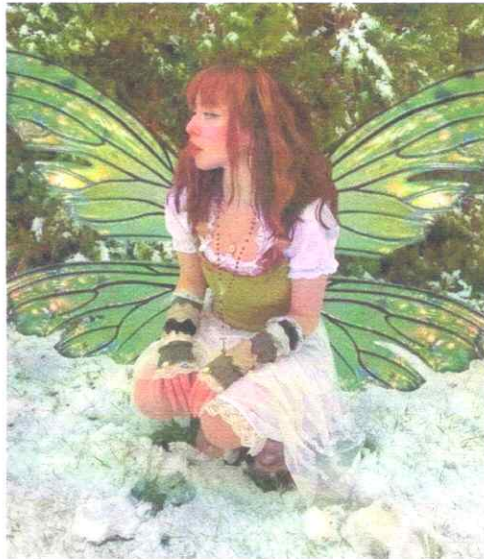
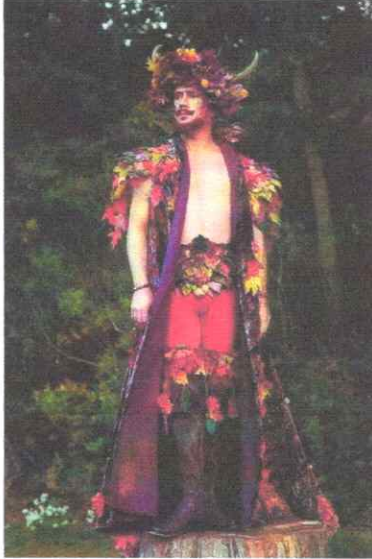

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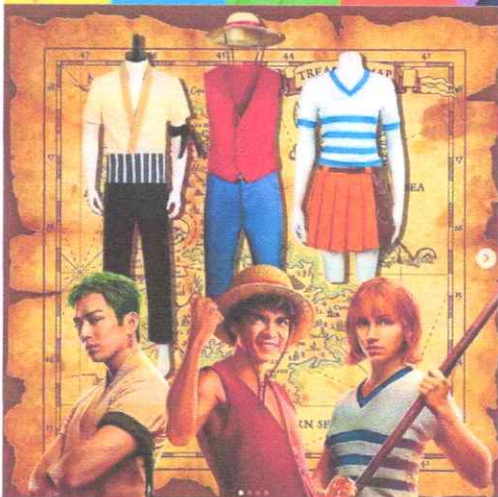
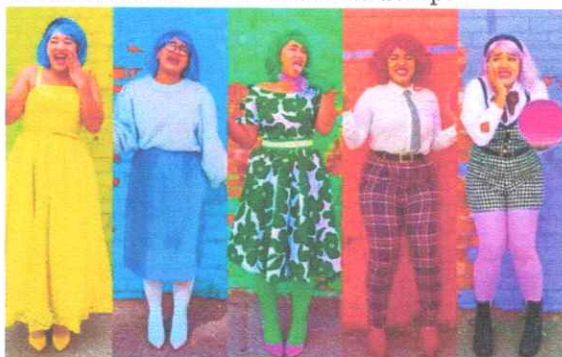
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Fantasy or Fictional Characters

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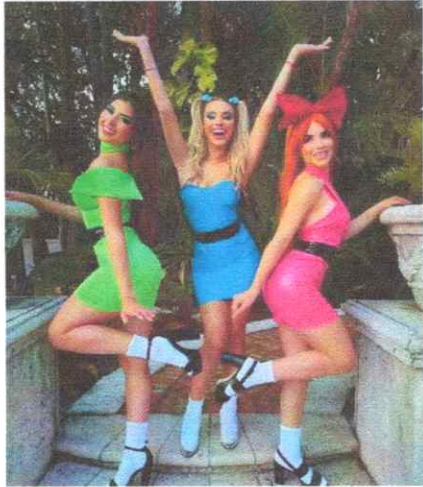
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Solarpunk Fashion

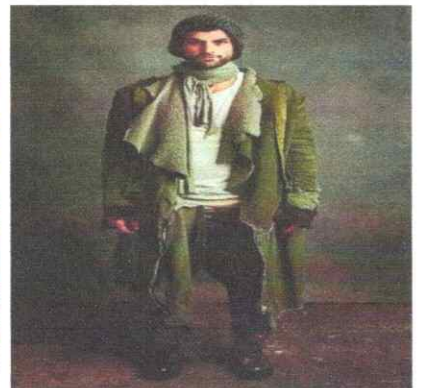

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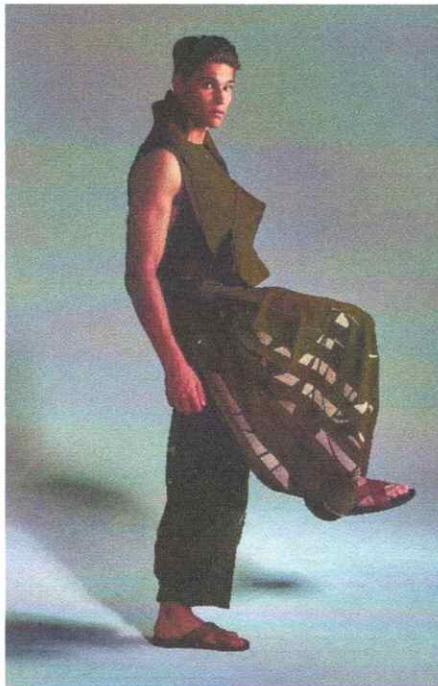
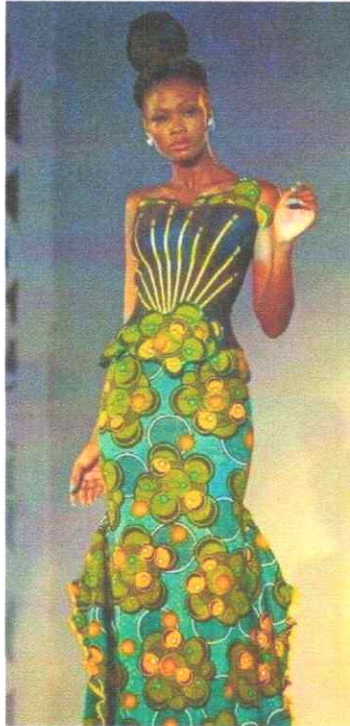
