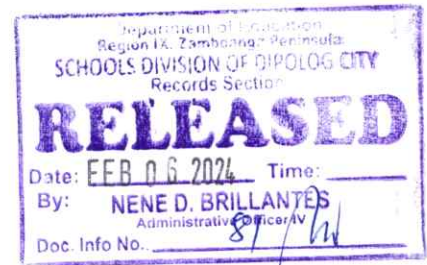

1. This Office endorses a total of **(274) students of Jose Rizal Memorial State University (JRMSU) Dipolog Campus** for the **Teaching Internship Experiential Learning Courses (ELC)**. The course will immerse pre-service teachers (PSTs) in actual classroom situations and a learning environment, under the supervision of a competent cooperating teacher.
2. This arrangement is consistent with the Memorandum of Agreement dated March 23, 2022, made and entered into by and between DepEd Dipolog City Division and JRMSU anchored on DepEd-CHED Joint Memorandum No. 1, s. 2021 and DepEd Order No. 3, s. 2007 which underscores the important roles of both parties and the cooperating schools as well as the cooperating teachers in the ELC implementation.
3. The role of the cooperating principal and cooperating teacher is crucial in the ELC implementation to ensure that the training of PSTs is aligned with the aim of both DepEd and TELs: develop future teachers who are competent to teach in the field.
4. The cooperating school principal and identified cooperating teachers must see to it that the tasks assigned to PSTs are consistent with the objectives of the ELC and limited to its specific requirements and activities. In coordination with JRSMU Dipolog Campus, the cooperating school must strive to sufficiently provide learning and development opportunities that will prepare the next batch of teachers to address the challenges of the education landscape in public schools.

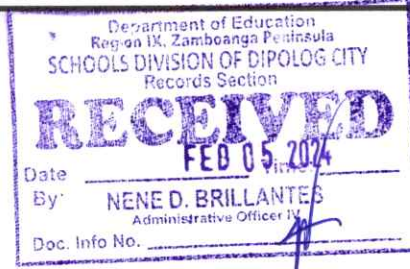




