

PROJECT PROPOSAL

Two-Day Training on Orientation and Mobility, Basic Therapy, and Assessment for Low Vision

Target Audience: Parents and Teachers of Children with Visual Impairment, PDAO of different

Municipalities and Cities

Training Dates: May 16-17, 2025

Training Location: Calamba, Misamis Occidental

Training Objectives:

- Early Identification and Intervention: Recognize and assess a child's disability early to provide timely intervention, maximizing their potential.
- Orientation and Mobility (O&M): Understand the principles of O&M and apply basic techniques to support children's independent movement.
- Therapeutic Interventions: Implement basic therapeutic strategies to enhance visual and motor skills, as well as daily living abilities.
- Assessment Techniques: Conduct basic assessments to identify a child's visual needs and strengths.
- Collaborative Environment: Work effectively with others to create a supportive and inclusive learning environment for children with visual impairments.
- Access to Resources: Utilize available resources and support networks to assist children with visual impairments and their families.

Training Content:

Day 1: Orientation and Mobility (O&M) and Basic Assessment

Morning:

- Introduction to O&M, including concepts and techniques (sighted guide and using a cane).
- Early Intervention
- Practical exercises on using canes, following trails, and spatial awareness.



Afternoon:

- Basic Low Vision Assessment of visual skills, including visual acuity, visual field, and visual perception.
- Case studies and group discussions on adapting the environment and activities for children with varying visual needs.

Day 2: Basic Therapy Collaborative Strategies

Morning:

 Introduction to basic visual therapy techniques, focusing on activities to improve visual skills, such as eye tracking, visual attention, and visual memory.

Afternoon:

- Strategies for effective collaboration between parents, teachers, and other professionals.
- Discussion on Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and creating an inclusive learning environment.
- Resource sharing and networking opportunities.

Number of Participants:

The training is designed for up to 50 participants, including parents and teachers.

Training Methodology:

The training will utilize a blended learning approach, combining interactive lectures, practical demonstrations, hands-on activities, group discussions, and case studies. Participants will have ample opportunities to practice new skills and share their experiences.

Materials:

All participants will receive handouts and worksheets.

Evaluation:

Participants' learning will be assessed through pre- and post-training questionnaires and active participation in discussions and activities. Feedback will be collected through a post-training evaluation form.
