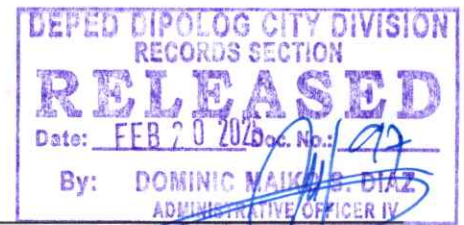

1. Pursuant to the mandate of the Department, through the Bureau of Learner Support Services – Youth Formation Division, and in support of the effective implementation of the Learner Government Program (LGP) and the Leadership, Advocacy, and Campaign Development Program (LACDP), this Division will host the first **Learners' Convergence Dipolog (LearnCon DPL or LCDPL) 2025** on **March 14–15, 2025**, at **Mibang Hotel, Dipolog City**.

2. The Learners' Convergence Dipolog (LearnCon DPL) serves as the division-level counterpart of the Learners' Convergence Philippines, an annual event first launched in 2022 in Palawan. This gathering brings together select learners, youth leaders, and education stakeholders from the 38 elementary schools and 16 high schools of SDO Dipolog City. LearnCon DPL provides participants with a unique opportunity to gain valuable insights from experienced speakers, engage in interactive activities, and foster meaningful connections with fellow learners. It also promotes cultural appreciation across the 21 barangays of Dipolog City while equipping participants with the leadership skills necessary to create a lasting impact in their communities. Specifically, LearnCon DPL 2025 aims to achieve the following objectives:

- Highlight key DepEd BLSS-YFD programs, projects, policies, and development opportunities for both learners and educators.
- Provide insights, recommendations, and concrete initiatives to address challenges faced by schools and the learners.
- Engage in knowledge-sharing and collaborative problem-solving on issues affecting the children and youth and their communities.



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- Take the lead in civic engagement, health and well-being, gender and social inclusion, climate action, innovation and future readiness, culture and arts, and peacebuilding.
- Build networks with a diverse community of advocates to drive meaningful, responsive, and impactful change.

5. The upcoming Convergence, themed **#IAMABatangDipag: Empowering Learners, Strengthening Communities**, marks the inaugural Learners' Convergence Dipolog (LCDPL). This milestone event will feature engaging learning sessions, interactive activities, and a dedicated mental health and wellness session, fostering holistic development among participants. The elections for the Division Federation SELG and SSLG for SY 2025-2026 will also take place, ensuring the continued empowerment of learner-leaders in shaping the future of their communities.

6. For ease of reference, contained in this Division Memorandum are the administrative guidelines, pre-registration form, parental consent and waiver form, indicative program, and work plan.

**ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE LEARNERS'  
CONVERGENCE DIPOLOG 2025**

**I. PRE-CONVERGENCE PREPARATION**

**A. General Guidelines**

1. To ensure participation on March 14, 2025, all 16 secondary schools are requested to select five (5) representatives, consisting of four (4) learners and one (1) chaperone. Selection should be based on the following composition, qualifications and criteria:
  - a. Learners
    - Bona fide secondary school learner
    - With good moral character
    - Physically fit and capable of participating actively and collaboratively in all activities; and
    - Able to represent any of the following learner representation:
      - One (1) outgoing SSLG President
      - One (1) incoming SSLG President
      - One (1) incoming YES-O President/Committee Head
      - One (1) incoming BKD+ President/Committee Head
    - *Special Participation: One (1) Division-Level Qualifier Image Bearer for ZNNHS, ZNNHS Turno, Gulayon IS, Punta NHS, Dipolog City NHS, and Pamansalan Eco-Tech HS only.*
  - b. Chaperone
    - With good office standing and professional ethics
    - Hold a regular teaching position as TI to MTIII (preferably teaching Araling Panlipunan) designated by the School Principal as the SSLG Teacher-Adviser for SY 2025-2026
    - Able to provide guidance to the learner-representatives all throughout the event
    - With relevant experience in youth formation programs, projects, activities, engagements, and at least one (1) year in service in his/her current station/school
    - Physically fit and capable of participating actively in all activities; and
    - Able to perform all the tasks expected of them



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2. To ensure participation on March 15, 2025, all 38 elementary schools are requested to select three (3) representatives, consisting of two (2) learners and one (1) chaperone. Selection should be based on the following composition, qualifications and criteria:
  - a. Learners
    - Bona fide elementary school learner
    - With good moral character
    - Physically fit and capable of participating actively and collaboratively in all activities; and
    - Able to represent any of the following learner representation:
      - One (1) outgoing SELG President
      - One (1) incoming SELG President
  - b. Chaperone
    - With good office standing and professional ethics
    - Hold a regular teaching position as TI to MTIII (preferably teaching Araling Panlipunan) designated by the School Principal as the SELG Teacher-Adviser for SY 2025-2026
    - Able to provide guidance to the learner-representatives all throughout the event
    - With relevant experience in youth formation programs, projects, activities, engagements, and at least one (1) year in service in his/her current station/school
    - Physically fit and capable of participating actively in all activities; and
    - Able to perform all the tasks expected of them
3. The designated chaperones shall serve as the focal persons of their respective school delegation. They shall coordinate closely with the learner-representatives and shall provide assistance in the completion and submission of the following requirements:
  - Designation Order
  - Pre-registration Form duly signed by the Principal. See Enclosure 4 for the template.
  - Parental Consent and Waiver Form duly signed by the parent or guardian. See Enclosure 5 for the template.

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4. The designated chaperones, after the completion of all required documents, shall:
  - Scan all the required documents and submit via email to [youthformation.dipolog@deped.gov.ph](mailto:youthformation.dipolog@deped.gov.ph), on or before **March 3, 2025**.
5. The Teacher-Advisers/Chaperones, in coordination with the Division LF Coordinators, are also responsible for setting up a booth during the event, featuring KABILIN Accomplishment and Assessment Reports (AARs) from various schools, along with selected best practices and innovative initiatives.
6. Learner representatives are also required to prepare a Team Yell and Variety Performance as part of their team-building activity. Each performance must begin with a 30-second Team Yell before transitioning into the variety segment, which may include dance, choral singing, *sabayang pagbigkas*, or any entertaining but meaningful presentation. Performances should align with the LCDPL 2025 theme, “#IAmABatangDipag: Empowering Learners, Strengthening Communities,” and all team members must wear their designated team colors. Overall performance should not exceed to 3 minutes. Criteria will be announced upon release of the memorandum. *Note: Image Bearers need not join the Team Yell and Variety Performance.*

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## **II. CONVERGENCE PROPER**

### **A. Arrival of Participants**

1. All participants shall arrive at the venue, Mibang Hotel, Dipolog City, on March 14, 2025 (Secondary Schools) and March 15, 2025 (Elementary Schools), at exactly 7:00 a.m.
2. Every participant is required to accomplish the registration and attendance, and take assessment tests (pre-test & post-test) and activity evaluation.

### **B. No Registration Fee**

1. No registration fee shall be collected and/or be charged to all delegates for participating in the Learners' Convergence Dipolog 2025. Furthermore, no fees shall be collected for other purposes associated with participating in the Convergence.
2. Transportation expenses for delegates and chaperones shall be charged to the School MOOE, PTA-VSC, or any available local funds, in accordance with standard accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

### **C. Meals**

1. Snacks and lunch will be provided by the organizer.
2. All participants are encouraged to bring their own water tumblers to promote sustainability.

### **D. Attire**

1. All team members must wear their designated team colors.
2. The DFSSLG Batch Leading Lights should also bring their batch shirt.

### **E. Booth**

1. A showcase of various projects, initiatives, best practices, and organization accomplishments through interactive booths will be installed by the Teacher-Advisers.



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**F. Presentation of KABILIN Annual Accomplishment Report**

1. Outgoing SELG/SSLG Presidents and their respective advisers who have submitted their KABILIN will be invited to the front to present their outputs to the SDO Top Management and Officers.
2. Following the presentation, the presidents will be honored with the Leadership Excellence Award, recognizing their accomplishments based on their submitted reports. Select teacher-advisers will also be acknowledged for their dedication and invaluable contributions.
3. As stated in Division Memorandum No. 54, s. 2025, presidents who attain a total score of 50 points or higher will be awarded the prestigious Rising Radiant Medal (Gold), symbolizing exemplary leadership and impact. Those scoring below 50 points will receive the Dawning Spark Medal (Silver), signifying their promising leadership potential. Meanwhile, presidents who fail to submit their President's Portfolio and/or their school's KABILIN within the stipulated timeframe will be given the Aspirant's Medal (Bronze) as a token of acknowledgment.

**G. Interactive Learning Sessions**

1. Sessions covering areas such as media literacy, environmental stewardship, mental health and well-being will be facilitated by various resource speakers and experts.

**H. DFSSLG Elections for SY 2025-2026**

1. The SSLG Presidents from 16 high schools shall submit their Profile form on or before **March 1, 2025**, to the [youthformation.dipolog@deped.gov.ph](mailto:youthformation.dipolog@deped.gov.ph) with the ff. requirements:
  - Half-body shot portrait wearing school uniform
  - SSLG President Profile (*See Enclosure 2 for the template*)
2. On election day, each president will have one minute to introduce themselves, outlining their platforms and vision for the upcoming school year. Following this, the coordinators will present each candidate's profile, including their individual perspectives on pressing social issues affecting the youth. Eight (8) presidents will also be randomly selected to participate in a debate.
3. All SSLG Presidents are strongly encouraged to thoroughly read and familiarize themselves with the Youth Formation Division's programs,





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projects, and activities, as well as the SSLG Constitution and By-Laws, as outlined in Enclosure 6. Their knowledge of these subjects will be assessed to ensure an informed selection process, allowing fellow presidents to evaluate candidates before casting their votes.

4. Only the newly elected SSLG Presidents are eligible to vote in the DFSSLG Elections. Meanwhile, all other student participants are expected to remain attentive, maintain proper decorum, and observe the election process with keen awareness.

**I. DFSELG Elections for SY 2025-2026**

1. The SELG Presidents from 38 elementary schools\*will each have one minute to introduce themselves, highlighting their platforms and vision for the upcoming school year before the election begins.
2. Only the newly elected SELG Presidents are eligible to vote in the DFSELG Elections. Meanwhile, all other student participants are expected to remain attentive, maintain proper decorum, and observe the election process with keen awareness.
