

**OBSERVANCE OF NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MONTH AND
CELEBRATION OF NATIONAL STUDENTS' DAY**

1. Pursuant to the Department of Education Office of the Undersecretary for Governance and Operations Memorandum No. 11-06533, titled “Celebration of the Children’s Month and National Students’ Day 2025,” all public and private basic education institutions are hereby enjoined to observe and celebrate the **National Children’s Month (NCM) throughout November 2025**, and the **National Students’ Day (NSD) on November 17, 2025**.

2. Attached herewith is the abovementioned national memorandum for the reference and guidance of school heads and program implementers under the Learner Rights and Protection Program, Learner Government Program, and Leadership, Advocacy, and Campaigns Development Program. **School heads are directed to peruse the memorandum as it outlines the recommended activities that may be undertaken to meaningfully commemorate these national observances.**

3. Emphasis is placed on the proper documentation and submission of accomplishment reports for the implementation of these initiatives. All schools are required to submit and upload their reports on or before December 1, 2025, through the following links:

4. Schools must also send a copy of their uploaded accomplishment reports to the **DepEd Dipolog Learner Formation Unit** via email at **youthformation.dipolog@deped.gov.ph**. The Unit shall evaluate and consolidate submissions, which will serve as the basis for the issuance of Certificates of Recognition to exemplary implementing schools.



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5. Expenses incurred in the conduct of activities relative to these observances may be charged against local funds, PTA-VSC funds, or other available funding sources allocated for Youth Development Programs, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Schools are likewise encouraged to forge partnerships with National Government Agencies (NGAs), Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), Local Government Units (LGUs), and other internal and external stakeholders to enhance resource mobilization, promote inclusivity, and strengthen community engagement in advancing the welfare, leadership, and participation of learners.

DATE : October 28, 2025

The Department of Education (DepEd) joins the Council for Welfare of Children (CWC), the National Youth Commission (NYC), the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), local government units, and private organizations including the civil society, private enterprises, and nongovernment, civic, and people's organizations, and the whole nation in celebrating the National Children's Month (NCM) and the National Students' Day (NSD) 2025 with the theme, "**OSAEC-CSAEM Wakasan: Kaligtasan at Karapatan ng Bawat Batang Mag-aaral, Ipaglaban!**"

This year, the celebration of both the NCM and NSD shall be led by the Bureau of Learner Support Services (BLSS), through its Learner Rights and Protection Division (LRPD) and Youth Formation Division (YFD).

Background

The observance of the **NCM** is anchored in Republic Act (R.A.) No. 10661, which declared November as *Buwan ng mga Bata*. The celebration of the NCM is aligned with the Philippines' adoption of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) on November 20, 1989, to promote children's rights. Section 4 thereof mandates DepEd to facilitate and encourage the commemoration of the NCM in all schools, public and private, nationwide.

In observance of the **NSD**, R.A. No. 11369 designates November 17 of each year as a day to celebrate and recognize the vital role of students in nation-building. This annual celebration seeks to encourage active civic engagement and empower future leaders and changemakers. The observance of the NSD is also aligned with the

principles of the UNCRC, which uphold the importance of student voices and their contributions to society. Further, the celebration of the NSD supports the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, particularly Goal 4 on Quality Education, which promotes inclusive, equitable, and participatory learning environments.

For 2025, the NCM-NSD will focus on the roles of learners in reporting and preventing Online Sexual Abuse or Exploitation of Children and Child Sexual Abuse or Exploitation Materials (OSAEC-CSAEM). Under the UNCRC, every child has the right to be protected from all forms of sexual exploitation and abuse, harmful media, and violations of their privacy. In the digital age, these rights are increasingly challenged in new and complex ways.

The NCM also observes the **National Play Advocacy Week (NPAW)** every 3rd week of November. The NPAW is an annual week-long celebration dedicated to highlighting children's right to play and emphasizing its importance in their development and holistic well-being. Moreover, it is an initiative that encourages everyone to provide platforms where children can enjoy their right to play throughout the week.

Actionable Points

In this regard, all levels of DepEd governance, including schools and private basic education institutions, are encouraged to participate in the month-long celebration of the NCM. The same are encouraged to undertake programs and/or activities based on the recommended activities (see **Enclosure 1**) and may also initiate their activities within November.

As part of the culminating celebration of the NCM-NSD 2025, the BLSS, through the LRPD and YFD, will conduct an activity in Oriental Mindoro on **November 15-18, 2025**. The concerned Regional Focal Persons of the LRPD are invited to participate in providing services and conducting simultaneous discussions with the learners.

Nationwide CyberSafety Caravan	<p>This aims to teach children and school personnel regarding safety in digital spaces, recognizing red flags when accessing online applications or websites, the reporting mechanisms for probable incidents of OSAEC-CSAEM, and identifying online behaviors of possible perpetrators.</p> <p>Schools, private organizations, and local government units may reach out to national government agencies, including law enforcement agencies, in organizing a CyberSafety Caravan.</p>
Training of Trainers on OSAEC-CSAEM Prevention	<p>This aims to train adults to facilitate future activities relevant to OSAEC-CSAEM prevention and empower adult participants as champions in the school and within the community.</p>
TechTalk Seminar for Parents-Teachers Associations	<p>The Seminar aims to help parents, guardians, and teachers build trust and create open communication with children in terms of their digital and social media use, and how to set healthy screen time and use of digital media.</p>
FOR THE NATIONAL PLAY ADVOCACY WEEK (3rd Week of November)	
Sabayang Pambatang Palarong Pinoy (PPP)	<p>Play is essential to a child's overall healthy development and well-being.
